#### **ACCEPTED**

All items must be clean and dry. Keep caps on bottles and jugs. Labels may stay.

- Metal cans
- Cartons
- Paper products
- Paperboard
- Magazines
- Phone books
- Flatten cardboard
- Rigid plastic containers (bottles, jugs and tubs)
- Glass containers (remove metal lids)
- Scrap Tires (during fair weather months starting early summer 2021)

#### **NOT ACCEPTED**

Any item that can contaminate or damage the sorting equipment is not accepted.

- Gift wrapping
- Bakeware and dishes
- Styrofoam
- Greasy pizza boxes
- Items contaminated with food, oil or dirt
- Items larger than a 5-gallon bucket
- Tanglers (stringy items like hoses, clothing, tarps, bubble wrap and tubing)
- Plastics that can be poked with your finger (shopping bags, storage bags, packaging plastic)
