# NEWS TO USE

### **SCHOOL ELECTION MAY 7, 2024**

Polls are open 7:00AM until 8:00PM for in-person voting. West Ottawa Public Schools and Grand Haven Public Schools have renewal millage requests on their prospective ballots. Absent Voter Applications were mailed in mid-March to voters who are on the Permanent Absent Voter Application List. Permanent Ballot List voters were mailed a ballot automatically the last week of March for the May 7, 2024 election. Please contact Clerk Meredith Hemmeke if you plan to be absent from your residential address, as ballots are not forwardable by the USPS.

# Michigan Law requires a voter-completed application before being issued a ballot.

**In-Person Voting:** At a voting location, the voter completes a paper <u>application</u> requesting a ballot.

Permanent Absent Voter List (AV List)- The voter automatically receives <u>an application</u> by mail to vote prior to each election. Upon return of this application to the Port Sheldon Township Clerk, the voter is mailed an absent voter ballot.

**Permanent Ballot List (PB List)-** Following recent legislation, the voter now has the option to receive a **ballot** automatically prior to each election, by completing a **one-time** written application.

## **ABSENT VOTER BALLOT OPTIONS**

Voters receiving absent voter ballots have several options available.

Voters may return ballots in three ways – by Postal Mail, by 24-hour drop box, or in person during office hours. Ballots must be received by 8:00PM on election day.

Voters who received an absent voter ballot and wish to vote in person may do so, but <u>must bring</u> their absent voter ballot to the voting location.

Materials NOT accepted: Paints, drain oils, solvents and other petroleum products, fuel tanks, sealed containers. Lawn and yard waste, branches and tree stumps WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
